PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: COME ON SUMMER!


With the recent days of "mostly sunshine", this writer is eagerly looking forward to some warmer weather. The shop is currently a mess with stuff piled everywhere but with the recent sunshine, I feel the urge to begin the arduous task of beginning the shop clean up. Current projects include repairing several models and building one or two new models for the upcoming contest season. Truth be told, I probably have more than enough models to fly.... My point in all of this is to prod everyone to begin thinking about the stuff that you will need for the upcoming contest season. While this list might range from rubber to glow fuel to the proper size prop for your model, all of this takes time to gather up. A bit of time spent now inventorying your models and field supplies will really pay off in the near future with better contests and trim sessions.

Updated Rules for the Vintage Coupe Category

Below are the final Coupe Cup guidelines approved at the 3/09/24 WMC Meeting. Note the elimination of the 1970 rule and the requirement to replace carbon pieces with traditional materials.

Guidelines to qualify for the Coupe Cup:

- All wood construction plus other traditional materials. No carbon fiber.
- 70g. airframe weight, 10g. rubber, lubed.
- No cross-section requirement.
- For published designs the original prop dia. & type (single, double, folding, etc.) must be used.
- No ROG required, no landing gear or take off devices required.
- No auto surfaces or auto prop assemblies may be used even if included on the original design.
- Various prop hubs may be used (Montreal, Simple Torque, Teeny Torque, etc.).
- Original unpublished designs qualify, as do NEW original designs that meet the above guidelines.
- Models built from contemporary stick and tissue kits qualify, though any carbon fiber or non traditional materials included in the kit must be replaced with traditional materials.

Flight requirements:

- Five two-minute maxes, followed by consecutive 30 sec. increases per fly off flight.
- The best two scores from the three sanctioned WMC contests and the two sanctioned SAM 8 contests will qualify. The third best score will serve as a tie-breaker.

How to be included in the competition:

- The official event will be the long-standing "Coupe/A-1" event. ANY Coupe or A-I towline glider is covered within this event.
- To qualify for the Coupe Cup simply note on your time card "C.C." certifying that your model complies with the guidelines above.
- When you turn in your time, assure your times are marked by the CD as C.C. on the event sheet. This will NOT impact your overall score in the Coupe/A-1 event.
- Club officers & CDs will carry Coupe Cup results separately & may post them at the contest table.
- The Coupe Cup will be awarded at the Fall Annual contest along with all the other annual awards .


